CANADIAN MINE WORKERS UNION FONDS. — [ca. 1972]-1978

***Physical Description:***

1.76 m of textual records : and other material.

***Administrative History:***

Dates of Founding/Dissolution: Established 1972; dissolved 1978 because of closure of Clinton Creek mine. Mandate: The Canadian Mine Workers Union represented workers at the Clinton Creek asbestos mine from 1972 to 1978. Predecessor/Successor Body: The Canadian Mine Workers separated from the United Steel Workers in 1972 as a result of a jurisdictional dispute between the international union and the workers at the Clinton Creek asbestos mine. Other Information: Clinton Creek was the location of the only Canadian Mine Workers local in the Yukon.

***Scope and Content:***

This fonds contains corporate records, photographs of Clinton Creek mine, sound recordings of meetings, and a location map of mining properties. Series include Corporate Records; Sound Recordings; Photographs and Mining Properties Map.
